


MAP OF RIDDLE POINT PARK



Lake Lemon Riddle Point Park

Welcome to Lake Lemon and Riddle Point Park! Our lake is the 7th largest public reservoir in the state of Indiana with a size of 1,650 surface acres. In addition to a beautiful water resource, Riddle Point Park also offers many fun recreational amenities for both residents and the public to enjoy!



Riddle Point Park Rules:

1. Park Hours: Sunrise to Sunset
2. Park Gates Locked at Sunset
3. No Overnight Camping
4. Ground Fires Not Permitted
5. No life guard on duty; Swim at your own risk
6. Swimming allowed in buoyed area only
7. Glass Containers Not Allowed on Beach

8. No tampering with beach buoys
9. No Littering
10. No Off-Road Vehicles
11. No Dogs allowed in buoyed swim area
12. Dogs on beach, Must be Leashed

"Pursuant to Indiana Code 35-43-2-2, persons entering or using the park property before sunrise or after sunset are subject to arrest for criminal trespass."

RIDDLE POINT PARK

Welcome to Lake Lemon and Riddle Point Park. Our lake is the 7th largest public reservoir in the state of Indiana with a size of 1,650 surface acres. In addition to a beautiful water resource, Riddle Point Park also offers many fun recreational amenities for both residents and the public to enjoy.

Admission is charged to enter the park between Memorial Day weekend and Labor Day weekend. Admission into Riddle Point Park is as follows:

Daily Admission \$5.00/vehicle

Season Pass \$60.00/vehicle


Many people visit the park to picnic and fish from the shoreline. Riddle Point is optimal for shoreline fishing as it is surrounded by water on three sides. There are also many picnic areas on the Point for users to enjoy.



There is a public beach within the park. The beach area is clearly marked with buoys to notify boaters of the safe swimming area. Please be aware there are no lifeguards on duty at the Lake Lemon Beach.

The park has a sand volleyball court and a horseshoe-throwing pit. Volleyballs and horseshoes can be borrowed from the Riddle Point gatehouse.


There is also a public boat ramp at Riddle Point Park. **(Please see the Boating Brochure for details.)**



A shelter is available for daily rentals from dawn to dusk. Cost to rent the shelter is \$125.00 plus a \$100.00 refundable damage deposit. Shelter reservation forms may be obtained at the Riddle Point Park office or by visiting <http://www.lakelemon.org/forms>

Riddle Point Park also has a short hiking trail located on the south end of the park. The Tulip Trace Nature Trail was recently renovated by Boy Scout Troop#110 from Unionville, IN. The troop repaired a foot bridge, added mulch to the trail, and constructed a comfortable bench to a scenic overlook area, providing a great view of the lake. The trail head is located at the Camp Rock driveway on the south side of Riddle Point Park.



When visiting and utilizing Riddle Point Park, please use your utmost due-diligence in keeping the park clean. Trash barrels are located through out the park to dispose of refuse. While dogs are allowed in the park, we ask that you keep a close eye on them and carry bags with you to dispose of any waste.
