2014 LLCDC Annual Meeting Summary

The LLCDC held its Nineteenth Annual Meeting on February 19, 2014 at the Benton Township Senior Citizens Building. *Sue Miller*, Sub-Area II, was elected to her first four year term on the Board of Directors. *Pam Dugan*, Sub-Area VI, was re-elected for her second four year term on the Board. *Kim Mayer*, Sub-Area III, was appointed by the Board to fill a vacancy until the 2015 Annual Meeting. The Board of Directors elected officers for 2014, they are: John Schell, Chairman; Pam Dugan, Vice-Chairman; and Lance Eberle, Treasurer.

Lake Enhancement Program

The 2014 Lake Enhancement Program will start the season with debris removal around the lake. Once debris removal is completed, the first priority for sediment removal is the East side of Reed Point (service zone 130) followed by an access channel leading to Pt. Idalawn (219) and an area just East of the Spillway (114).

Freeholders interested in Private Dredging should contact the LLCDC Office to get on the Sign-Up Sheet. There is no priority to the private dredging list. If the LLCDC is currently dredging in your service zone, private dredging will be available upon completion of the channel. Once the LLCDC has finished in a service zone, the LLCDC Office will contact the interested Freeholders about the private dredging service.

Canada Geese

The LLCDD will continue efforts in Canada Geese egg treatment, or “egg shaking”. This will help limit the resident geese population at Lake Lemon. Canada Geese are detrimental to the lake for numerous reasons. Goose droppings introduce fecal coliform into the water column which in part introduces diseases and parasites that threaten native wildlife. Canada Geese are aggressive and large populations will compete with native waterfowl for habitat. Limiting the population size will help to prevent the ill effects of Canada Geese on the lake.

If you are aware of areas around the lake with increased Canada Goose nesting, please contact James Van Tassel, Lake Biologist.

Although not required by law, Indiana Boater Education course offers knowledge for both the novice and experienced boaters. The class teaches not only rules of the road and how to operate a motorboat, it also informs the boater of laws regarding operation of a watercraft. The class will be taught by an Indiana Conservation Officer and will allow for time for questions to be asked (by those who attend the course). A youngster who is 15 years old and holds a valid state issued identification card can benefit greatly from the course, with a passing grade the youngster can legally operate a motorboat and jet ski. Other benefits include, but are not limited to: possible cheaper rate on insurance and knowledge of safety requirements.
