#### **Lake Lemon Conservancy District Board of Directors Meeting Minutes**

The April 20, 2011 meeting of the Lake Lemon Conservancy District was held at the Benton Township Senior Citizen Building and was called to order by Chairman John Schell at 6:10 p.m.

BOARD MEMBERS PRESENT: Marty Mann, Tina Thrasher, Dennis Friesel, Pam Dugan, Tim Specht, John Schell, Bruce Cassal, ALSO PRESENT: Bob Madden, Manager; Adam Casey, Board Recorder; and LLCD Freeholders (see attached sign-in sheet). ABSENT: Rachel Atz, CBU Representative.

#### I. OPENING COMMENTS (Schell)

• Schell thanked all freeholders for attending the meeting.

#### II. APPROVAL OF MEETING MINUTES (Schell)

• Approval of March 16, 2011 Board Meeting Minutes.

## CASSAL MOTIONED TO APPROVE MARCH 16, 2011 MINUTES. SPECHT SECONDED THE MOTION. ALL "AYES." MOTION CARRIED.

#### III. 2010 WATER TESTING RESULTS/ RE-NEW 2011-2012 AGREEMENT

- Madden introduced IU SPEA Professor Bill Jones and Melissa Clark
- There were no surprises or major concerns when reviewing 2010 water testing results.
- The lake showed normal increases in eutrophication throughout the 2010 season.
- 2 sampling locations are being added to the 2011-2012 water testing agreement. Bear Creek and the drainage area entering the North Shore Marina from the trailer park across North Shore Drive. These two locations will include sampling for fecal coliform and total suspended solids.
- Due to the addition of 2 sampling locations, the contract amount for the 2011-2012 Agreement has increased \$200/year.

FRIESEL MOTIONED TO APPROVE THE 2011-2012 WATER TESTING CONTRACT WITH INDIANA UNIVERSITY AS WRITTEN. DUGAN SECONDED THE MOTION. ALL "AYES". MOTION CARRIED.

#### IV. FREEHOLDER GAIL TALA: LAKE STEWARDSHIP PRESENTATION

- Gail Tala presented ideas that individuals can implement to reduce their impact on the lake.
- Ideas included the use of low flush toilets, proper maintenance of septic systems and reducing the use of phosphorous in yard fertilizers.
- Gail stated that she would also like to see a sustainability section added to LLCD newsletter to inform lake residents of good stewardship practices.

#### V. FREEHOLDER MARK DISALVO PRESENTATION

- Mark DiSalvo stated that the drainage pipe near his house that runs under South Shore Drive needs to be cleaned to allow proper drainage of ground runoff into the lake.
- DiSalvo also stated that he is in the process of proving ownership of a parcel of land adjacent to his house. The parcel is currently listed as CBU property and has two subleased docks on the parcel. DiSalvo requested that the docks be moved to a new area.
- Management stated the docks will not be re-located until private ownership of the parcel is verified.

## VI. DIRECTOR DENNIS FRIESEL: BOARD TREASURER POSITION PRESENTATION

- Friesel stated that he had received requests from freeholders to return to the board treasurer position.
- Schell stated that with the appointment of Shirley Watkins, CPA as Financial Clerk, did the board need a treasurer? Schell requested that Friesel prepare a list of treasurer duties for the Board so Members may assess how critical the position is to fill.
- Madden suggested that the treasurer position, if reinstated, be authorized by Board resolution.
- Schell, Friesel and Madden agreed to meet prior to the May meeting to discuss position.

## VII. DIRECTOR MARTY MANN PROPOSAL: CONFLICT OF INTEREST ADDENDUM DISCUSSION

- In order to prevent future conflicts of interest among board members and to
  protect board members from unknowingly becoming involved with a conflict of
  interest, Mann proposed 5 rules (See Attached) to be potentially added to the
  LLCD Conflict of Interest Policy Document.
- Mann read and discussed the potential rules and asked that board members review and add remarks/changes to the proposed rules prior to the May 18<sup>th</sup> board meeting. Mann would send out a word document of the proposed rules.
- Schell and Dugan recommended the proposed rules be reviewed by counsel.

#### VIII. MANAGER'S REPORT

- a) Budget Highlights (See Attached)
  - Report of Claims, March, 2011.
  - Madden reviewed the budget highlights for the month of March, 2011.

- b) HVAC Estimates for LLCD Office
  - 3 quotes were received for the replacement of the LLCD Office HVAC System.
  - Management recommended that the Board approve the lowest bid which was submitted by Commercial Service Inc., Bloomington.

# CASSAL MOTONED TO APPROVE THE HVAC REPLACEMENT CONTRACT WITH COMMERCIAL SERVICE INC. FOR THE QUOTED PRICE OF \$3,190.00. FRIESEL SECONDED THE MOTION. "ALL AYES". MOTION CARRIED.

- c) Mechanics Agreement: Lee Keen, Integritech Equipment Repair.
  - Management recommended the renewal of the Professional Services
     Agreement with Lee Keen to address barge equipment mechanical issues
     that cannot be repaired by LLCD staff.

# CASSAL MOTIONED TO APPROVE THE PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT WITH INTEGRITECH EQUIPMENT REPAIR FOR BARGE EQUIPMENT MAINTENANCE AS WRITTEN, AND NOT TO EXCEED AMOUNT OF \$5,000.00. DUGAN SECONDED THE MOTION. ALL"AYES". MOTION CARRIED

- d) Commercial Surplus Parcel Sublease Agreement Discussion/Approval
  - A \$500 per year fee will be assessed for the commercial surplus parcel agreement.
  - This agreement will allow the installation of 1 dock for commercial use accommodating 4 boats.
  - Discussion included how the Port Hole intends to monitor boats and patrons utilizing the commercial dock.

#### e) Operations Update

- a. Barge Operation
  - The barge was launched on Friday, April 15<sup>th</sup>.
  - The initial focus of the barge operation will be removal of lake debris and stumps.
- b. Possom Trot Disposal Site
  - The Possom Trot disposal site has been completed and is currently being used for disposal of lake debris.
- c. Lake Debris
  - Debris from late winter/early spring rains is severe.
  - Efforts concentrate on removing debris from boating lanes and north east corner of the long causeway.
  - Thirty stumps were marked with milk jugs during the winter drawdown and will be removed while the barge is focusing on debris.
- d. IDNR Nuisance Wildlife Permit
  - A permit has been acquired from IDNR for the treatment of Nuisance Wildlife, Canadian Geese.
  - On Friday April 15<sup>th</sup>, the lake biologist treated 175 eggs in 22 nests on Cemetery Island.

• Freeholder Barb Lewis suggested the Board consider developing a multi-year action plan.

### Lake Lemon Monitoring Program 2010 Executive Summary

The Lake Lemon Conservancy District (LLCD) has entered into a lease agreement with the City of Bloomington Utilities Service Board (USB) to maintain Lake Lemon in such condition necessary to protect the lake's water quality consistent with its potential use as a drinking water source. LLCD also agreed to maintain the lake in such condition to meet all state and federal requirements for recreational waters and to maintain the quality of the water in the lake at least at its present level. The LLCD has contracted with Indiana University's School of Public & Environmental Affairs (SPEA) to evaluate the condition of Lake Lemon since 1997.

#### **SAMPLING SEASON AND LOCATIONS:**

Three lake locations and one stream location was sampled during the 2010 sampling season (Table 1).

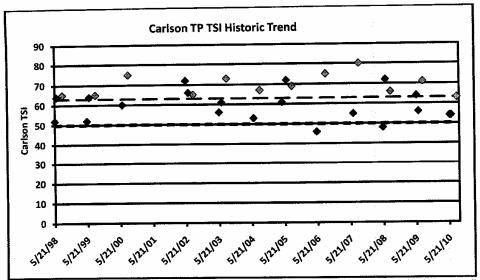

#### **WATER QUALITY RESULTS:**

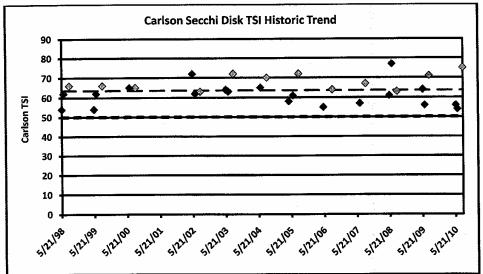
The water characteristics of Lake Lemon are highly variable due, in large part, to runoff from the very large watershed that can replace the entire lake volume in a relatively short time. This causes difficulties in monitoring because the water conditions at any particular time depend on several immeasurable variables, including: time since the last major storm and the intensity and duration of that storm. The May and June sampling events fell within normal late spring rains, while the August sampling event fell within the late summer drought. While these variables affect other Indiana lakes and reservoirs, they have a much greater influence at Lake Lemon because of its very large watershed and short residence time.

Lake Lemon suffers from seasonally high levels of phosphorus, suspended sediments, and relatively low Secchi disk transparency throughout the year; however, the overall trend for Lake Lemon has not changed in the last 13 years (Figures 1-3). Current and past water conditions unquestionably place the lake into the 'eutrophic' or over-productive trophic category. Eutrophic lakes produce more algae and rooted plants than the bacteria and microbes can decompose annually. As a result, decaying organic matter accumulates on the sediments where it contributes to low dissolved oxygen levels and decreased lake volume.

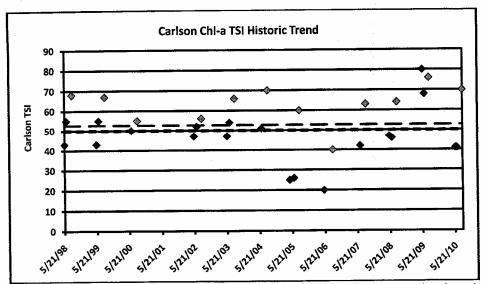
During the 2009 sampling season, there was particular interest in the high levels of fecal coliform bacteria entering the lake during and following wet weather events. However, the 2010 fecal coliform bacteria samples fell within the normal range for Lake Lemon (Table 2). The state standard of 200 colonies per 100mls was slightly exceeded at Chitwood #1 and Beanblossom Creek, which historically have higher concentrations.

Sedimentation and its consequences are likely the most pervasive problems currently facing Lake Lemon. The LLCD has initiated a dredging program at Lake Lemon. Dredging, along with controlling the watershed sources of sediment delivery, are the most needed lake management activities currently at the lake.

While Lake Lemon continues to face watershed and lake challenges ranging from eutrophic water conditions that usually peak towards the end of the summer season to watershed land uses, there has been no significant change over the last 13 years. Key eutrophy parameters (total phosphorus, chl-a, secchi disk transparency) have produced similar yearly results.

I have developed proposed conflict of interest rules language based on the concept that these rules would become an officially promulgated addendum to our current conflict of interest policy. I view the policy as a framework and the rules as extensions of the policy designed to address actual issues as the arise.

I would like to have this issue put on the next LLCD Board meeting agenda. Note that I will not be seeking final resolution of this issue at the meeting, but rather asking the Board members to take some time and add/subtract to the language with the goal of obtaining a consensus and passing the rules at a subsequent meeting. I have worked to write this language such that it applies to all board members and potential issues as opposed to a particular board member or issue.

#### Lake Lemon Conservancy District Conflict of Interest Policy Proposed Rules Promulgation

#### Proposed Rule 1

Purpose-Addresses existing conflicts of interest and appearances of a conflicts of interest for business agreements between an individual and the LLCD.

When an individual who has existing business dealing with LLCD is elected to the LLCD Board or is hired as a management employee the following rules are automatically applied:

- The LLCD Board shall evaluate the existing business dealing with the individual and determine if the business dealing should continue based on its value to the LLCD.
- If the LLCD Board determines that it is in the best interest of LLCD to continue the
  business dealing, the individual shall not participate in any discussions or votes
  concerning the business dealings within the context of the LLCD Board meetings, any
  LLCD authorized sub-committees and outside meetings with LLCD constituents or
  others.

#### Proposed Rule 2

Purpose-Prevents the occurrence of new conflicts of interest and appearances of a conflicts of interest for business agreements between an individual and the LLCD.

- LLCD Board members and management employees are disqualified from entering into any new direct or indirect business agreements or other business arrangements with the LLCD.
- The LLCD Board may only waive this rule if it determines that it is not practical to obtain the subject goods or services from other sources. In this case, the subject business dealing will be addressed by Rule 1.

#### Proposed Rule 3

Purpose-Addresses existing conflicts of interest and appearances of a conflicts of interest for private business activities that compete with or could be directly affected by LLCD policy.

When an individual who provides private business products or services on or around Lake Lemon that compete with or could be directly affected by LLCD policy is elected to the LLCD Board or is hired as a management employee the following rules are automatically applied:

May 24, 2011

The individual shall not participate in any discussions or votes concerning LLCD policy
on the matter within the context of the LLCD Board meetings, any LLCD authorized
sub-committees and outside meetings with LLCD constituents or others.

#### Proposed Rule 4

Purpose-Addresses potential appearances of impropriety involving business dealings between an individual who serves on the LLCD Board or is an LLCD management employee and LLCD for private business dealings grandfathered under Rule 1.

When an individual who has existing business dealings with LLCD is elected to the LLCD Board or is hired as a management employee and the business dealings are retained pursuant to Rule 1, the following additional rules are automatically applied:

The LLCD Board shall provide direct third party oversight of all monetary contract
payments or receipts between the individual and the LLCD including the quantification
of products or services that generate the money exchange. The third party oversight shall
be provided by the LLCD Board Treasurer or other LLCD Board designate and that
individual shall be personally present during critical meetings or site inspections that
serve to provide quantification of products or services that generate the money exchange.

#### Proposed Rule 5

Purpose-Prevents the occurrence of new conflicts of interest and appearances of a conflicts of interest involving business-oriented land development or land parcel sales activities within or immediately surrounding the LLCD.

- LLCD Board members and management employees shall immediately disclose to the LLCD Board any land development or land parcel sales activities in which the individual is involved with the exception of the individual's private residence.
- The LLCD Board shall develop appropriate rules of conduct for each such disclosure on a
  case-by-case basis such that the best interests of the LLCD are served.
