Lake Lemon Conservancy District Board of Directors Meeting Minutes

Benton Township Senior Citizens Building May 15th, 2013

The May 15th, 2013 Board of Directors Meeting of the Lake Lemon Conservancy District was held at the Benton Township Senior Citizens Building and was called to order by Chairman John Schell at 6:00 P.M.

BOARD MEMBERS PRESENT: John Schell, Pam Dugan, Lance Eberle, Tim Specht, Dennis Friesel Tina Thrasher. ALSO PRESENT: Bob Madden, Manager; James Van Tassel, Board Recorder; and LLCD Freeholders (see attached sign-in sheet). ABSENT: Rachel Atz, CBU Representative.

- I. Opening Comments (Schell)
 - a. Schell thanked the Freeholders for attending
- II. Approval of April 17, 2013 Board Meeting Minutes (Schell)

DUGAN MOTIONED TO APPROVE THE APRIL 17, 2013 BOARD MEETING MINUTES. THRASHER SECONDED THE MOTION. ALL "AYE'S". THE MOTION CARRIED.

- III. Treasurer's Report (Eberle)
 - a. April Financial Highlights
 - i. Revenue
 - 1. Increase in Watercraft Permit Sales and Launch Fees.
 - ii. Expenses
 - 1. \$5,679.00 for Shoreline Erosion Control (Rip Rap) on City of Bloomington property.
 - 2. \$2,000.00 Firework Show down payment.
 - b. Report of Claims Approval for April

EBERLE MOTIONED TO APPROVE THE ALLOWANCE OF VOUCHERS FOR APRIL 2013. SPECHT SECONDED THE MOTION. ALL "AYE'S". THE MOTION CARRIED.

- c. 2014 Budget Timeline (See Attached)
 - i. Eberle reviewed the 2014 Budget Timeline.
- d. Appointment of 2014 Budget Committee

i. In previous years the Budget Committee had consisted of the Officers of the Board plus the District Manager.

SPECHT MOTIONED TO APPROVE THE APPOINTMENT OF THE 2014 BUDGET COMMITTEE CONSISTING OF JOHN SCHELL, CHAIRMAN; PAM DUGAN, VICE CHAIR; LANCE EBERLE, TREASURER; AND BOB MADDEN, DISTRICT MANAGER. THRASHER SECONDED THE MOTION. ALL "AYE'S". THE MOTION CARRIED.

- IV. Appointment of Sub-Area III Director (Schell)
 - a. Post cards were sent out to all Sub-Area III Freeholders.
 - i. This will fill the Sub-Area III directorship vacancy until the next annual board meeting on February 5, 2014.
 - b. The LLCD Office received one letter of intent from Kim Mayer.
 - c. Tabled to June 22, 2013 Board Meeting
- V. Dredging Study Group: Update (Thrasher)
 - a. Recommendations
 - i. 2013 Private Dredging Service Fee
 - 1. The DSG recommended to the Board to consider increasing the Private Dredging Service Fee to \$1,250.00. This will cover expenses for future increased fuel costs and any unexpected repairs other than routine maintenance (oil, grease, filters).
 - a. Friesel commented the Freeholders are already paying for the equipment and maintenance.
 - b. Thrasher mentioned their will be no discount for partial barge loads.
 - c. Eberle commented the depreciation cost is included in Watkins' report. See how it is this year and base next year's fee off that.
 - d. Dugan commented there are people who think we shouldn't be in the business of private dredging and others who think we should.
 - e. Specht mentioned if there is a significant increase in the fee in following years, Freeholders will not be happy.

f. Freeholder, Cassal (I), commented that adding a third of the cost to the fee seems excessive.

SPECHT MOTIONED TO AMEND RESOLUTION 10-12-03's PRIVATE DREDGING FEE FROM \$500.00/BARGE LOAD TO \$1,000.00/BARGE LOAD. FRIESEL SECONDED THE MOTION. FIVE "AYE'S". DUGAN ABSTAINS. THE MOTION CARRIED.

- ii. 2013 Private Dredging Service Agreement Approval
 - 1. Thrasher asked the Board to review the contract.
 - 2. Private Dredging Service Fee will be paid in advance.
 - 3. Partial barge loads will be priced at the cost of a full barge load.
 - 4. An updated "Liability and Indemnification" clause states that the LLCD will not be held responsible for damages except in the case of gross negligence.
 - 5. It is recommended that all docks or non permanent structures be removed from the shoreline prior to private dredging.

FRIESEL MOTIONED TO APPROVE THE 2013 PRIVATE DREDGING SERVICE AGREEMENT. THRASHER SECONDED THE MOTION. FIVE "AYE'S". DUGAN ABSTAINS. THE MOTION CARRIED.

- iii. Barge Operations: In-House vs. Contractual
 - 1. The DSG compared the costs of sediment removal using private contractors and in-house operations.
 - 2. Considering private contractor's cubic yard cost, mobilization/demobilization, and use of the LLCD disposal site it is clear the LLCD's in-house operation is fiscally more efficient.

THRASHER MOTIONED TO APPROVE THE LLCD CONTINUE WITH INHOUSE OPERATIONS FOR THE SEDIMENT REMOVAL PROGRAM THROUGH AT LEAST 2013. DUGAN SECONDED THE MOTION. ALL "AYE'S". THE MOTION CARRIED.

- VI. Manager's Report (Madden)
 - a. Barge Operations: Update
 - i. Started with Debris Removal
 - ii. Shoreline Erosion Control (Rip-Rap)

1. 425 feet at Riddle Point Park

- iii. Dredging has commenced at Salmon Harbor
- b. Aquatic Vegetation: Update (Van Tassel)
 - i. Eurasian water milfoil is starting to appear in certain areas around the lake. Some shorelines are experiencing growth earlier than others. The bay east of Reed Point is starting to show signs of large milfoil beds. Milfoil out competes many native species by having an earlier and longer growing season. This is one characteristic of most invasive plants. Our applicator will be out in the next few weeks for a Tier 1 survey of the lake with the Lake Biologist. Our first treatment will be a week or so after the survey. Renovate, a systemic herbicide, will likely be used which is a preferred treatment for milfoil. The LLCD Office will send out an email with treatment maps and any restrictions prior to the application.

c. Safety Signage Discussion

- i. An indemnification clause is on the LLCD daily boat permits and on the annual registration cards.
- ii. Angela Parker, LLCD Attorney, wrote up a disclaimer to put on a 18"x 24" sign to be placed at Riddle Point Park and the Lake Lemon Marina.
- iii. Friesel mentioned he thought the sign was going to include a map of the lake with shallow areas marked. This could be in effect during only times of low lake level.
- iv. Dugan commented if you delineate one area you have to be sure to delineate all the shallow areas. It is near impossible to mark all shallow and hazard areas.
- v. Eberle stated the permit transaction gives the LLCD indemnification. The sign will provide more prudent notice.

DUGAN MOTIONED TO APPROVE THE PURCHASE AND USE OF THE SAFETY SIGNS PREPARED BY ANGELA PARKER, LLCD ATTORNEY. THRASHER SECONDED THE MOTION. FIVE "AYE'S". FRIESEL "NAY". THE MOTION CARRIED.

- d. Purchase Agreement: Riddle Point Park Boat Ramp Dock
 - i. Quotes were sent out to six commercial dock vendors.
 - ii. The LLCD received four quotes.

- iii. Deaton Waterfront Services out of Fishers, Indiana was the least expensive quote of \$18,792.00.
 - 1. Eberle asked if the wood decking will be marine grade lumber.
 - a. Madden replied he will follow up with Deaton to ensure marine decking is used.

SPECHT MOTIONED TO APPROVE THE PURCHASE AGREEMENT FOR THE RIDDLE POINT BOAT RAMP DOCK WITH DEATON WATERFRONT SERVICES. EBERLE SECONDED THE MOTION. FIVE "AYE'S". SCHELL ABSTAINED. THE MOTION CARRIED.

- e. Dock Request for Long Causeway Pond
 - i. Freeholder, Rebecca Ball, has requested the Board to consider approving a sublease dock on the East end of the pond South of the long causeway.
 - ii. No motorized boats will be permitted in the pond.
 - iii. Small boats with trolling motors are acceptable however, a LLCD boat registration sticker is required.
 - iv. The LLCD will have the option to approve the sublease on an annual basis.

THRASHER MOTIONED TO ALLOW BALL TO PLACE A SUBLEASE DOCK ON THE POND SOUTH OF THE LONG CAUSEWAY WITH A RESTRICTION OF NO MOTORIZED BOATS. SPECHT SECONDED THE MOTION. ALL "AYE'S". THE MOTION CARRIED.

VII. Public Comment (Schell)

- a. Randy Pruden (I) asked about the Canada Goose egg treatment.
 - Van Tassel replied the only accessible nests were found on Cemeteray Island. Twenty two nests were treated totaling 175 eggs. It appears to have been an effective treatment.
- b. Ron Thrasher (VII) asked how much sediment the LLCD Barge can hold.
 - i. Madden replied it is estimated the barge holds 105-110Y³. This can very slightly depending on the solidity of the material being removed.
 - ii. Schell replied he would measure the capacity of the barge prior to the next Board of Directors Meeting.

- c. Barbara Ritter (II) asked if renovate was going to be used for the first weed treatment.
 - i. Van Tassel commented he will recommend renovate is used since it is more effective on Eurasian water milfoil and milfoil is the primary weed present at this time of the year.
- d. Tom Diehl (VII) asked if the private dredging list is available to the Freeholders.
 - i. The Private Dredging Service Sign-Up Sheet is available on the LLCD website, lakelemon.org.

LLCD Private Dredging Service Agreement

Terms and Conditions

Lake Lemon Conservancy District (LLCD) is a special taxing unit responsible for the operation and maintenance of Lake Lemon. The LLCD acquired equipment to perform sediment removal based on a long term schedule that prioritizes the removal of sediment based on measured depth of water and the number of freeholders impacted. This long term plan focuses on the maintenance of navigation channels needed for lake access and restoration of navigational depth in the main body of the lake. The plan does not include the removal of sediment from docking areas. As a service to our freeholders, the LLCD is offering dredging services funded exclusively by the freeholder. This service is designed to provide sediment removal from docking areas not included in the dredging plan and areas within the plan that one or more freeholders wish to have sediment removed ahead of schedule.

where

Pricing

LLCD will provide dredging services to its freeholders at a rate based on its estimated direct costs of service, including labor, repair, fuel, maintenance, and supplies, all as determined and approved by the Board of Directors, in its discretion. The current price for sediment removal is as follows:

- Minimum Order- \$500.00 per barge load (up to approximately 100 cubic yards)
- Partial barge loads are priced at the minimum order cost.

Due to difficulty in estimating the amount of sediment removed from direct measurement of the lake bottom, pricing will be based on the amount of sediment placed on the barge, which has a measured full capacity of approximately 100 cubic yards.

Estimating the Sediment Quantity

The sediment quantity to be removed from an Agreement area will be estimated by the LLCD based on the size of the removal area, estimated current depth and estimated target depth. This sediment quantity will then be converted to estimated barge load(s) to compute the estimated price for the job. LLCD will strive to satisfy the sediment removal needs of its freeholders, however, it should be understood that sediment removal is an inherently imprecise operation and the estimate is the best determination of cost prior to commencement of a job.

Payment

The total amount charged to the freeholder will be based on the amount of sediment removed, measured to the full-barge load and not in smaller increments. LLCD will provide the freeholder with a volume and cost estimate at the time of Agreement execution. The freeholder shall remit payment to the LLCD, **in advance**, based on the cost estimate. At completion of the job, the LLCD will return excess payment if the amount of sediment actually removed to complete the job is less than the total amount

paid by the freeholder for the project. If the LLCD expends the amount paid based on the initial estimate prior to completion of the job or if the freeholder requests additional work, the LLCD will provide the freeholder with an estimate for the additional work. LLCD will receive authorization for the additional work and collect the estimated additional price prior to completing the job.

Job Standards

LLCD will remove sediment based on the work order area that will be marked with temporary markers where feasible to clearly designate the sediment removal area. LLCD will only remove the amount of sediment required to service the work area and will not exceed the estimated volume and price agreed to by the freeholder without authorization to increase the volume/cost of the job. Each barge load of sediment will be verified by signed load tickets and completed by the barge operator. The LLCD Manager will review and approve all load tickets. The barge operator will not be authorized to work outside the designated project area without approval of the LLCD Manager. The freeholder will not be authorized to make changes to the job with the barge operator but shall direct all requests to the LLCD Manager. The barge operator will be directed to immediately cease dredging operations if a dispute arises.

Liability and indemnification

The Freeholder shall indemnify and hold harmless Lake Lemon Conservancy District "LLCD" their representatives, members, designees, officers, directors, employees, agents, successors, and assigns ("Indemnified Parties"), from and against any and all claims for bodily injury, death or damage to property, demands, damages, actions, causes of action, suits, losses, judgments, obligations and any liabilities, costs and expenses (including but not limited to investigative and repair costs, attorneys' fees and costs, and consultants' fees and costs)("Claims") which arise or are in any way connected with the Work performed, Materials furnished, or Services provided under this Agreement by LLCD or its agents. Said indemnity and defense obligations shall further apply, whether or not said claims arise out of the concurrent act, omission, or negligence of the Indemnified Parties, whether active or passive. LLCD shall not be obligated to indemnify and defend claims found to be due to the sole negligence or willful misconduct of Indemnified Parties.

Dispute Resolution

If a dispute arises out of this Agreement, the freeholder must first submit such dispute to the LLCD Manager who shall attempt to resolve the dispute informally. In the event that the dispute is not resolved through the LLCD Manager, it shall be submitted to the LLCD Board of Directors for review and consideration at the next scheduled board meeting. The freeholder agrees to submit to this procedure to attempt to resolve any dispute before resorting to legal action against the LLCD. In the event that the LLCD incurs damages, attorney fees and/or expenses arising from this agreement, the freeholder shall pay such damages, attorney fees, and expenses incurred by the LLCD.

Schedule

The start date and completion date indicated in this Agreement is an estimate and the dates are not guaranteed. LLCD reserves the right to amend the dates, in its sole discretion, based on the conditions, requirements and other factors impacting scheduling and use of the dredging equipment.

Agreement Termination

The freeholder or LLCD may terminate the Agreement for any reason with written notice. If the freeholder terminates the agreement before the work begins, all money initially paid to the LLCD will be refunded in total within 30 days of Agreement termination. Termination of the Agreement during the project by either party will result in immediate cessation of sediment removal and the freeholder will be refunded any unused portion of payment(s) received based on the amount of sediment removed prior to Agreement termination, as defined by this Agreement.

Miscellaneous conditions

The provisions of this Agreement shall be construed in accordance with Indiana law. The parties waive trial by jury for any dispute arising out of this Agreement. The parties hereby stipulate that Monroe County, Indiana shall be the sole and exclusive venue for any dispute arising from this Agreement.

This Agreement contains and memorializes the entire understanding agreement of the parties and may be modified only by a written document, executed by the parties, except as expressly provided herein.

In the event any provision of this Agreement conflicts with applicable law, such conflict shall not affect other provisions of this Agreement which shall remain in full force and effect.

The Dredging Study Group (DSG) met on Saturday, May 11th at the LLCD Office, and at the conclusion of this meeting, made the below recommendations for consideration by the LLCD Board of Directors at it's upcoming meeting on May 15th, 2013.

I. Private Freeholder Dredging Discussion

- a. The current board approved fee for Private Dredging is \$500/Barge Load (100 Y³). Based on a report compiled in December 2012 by Shirley Watkins, LLCD Accountant, the LLCD barge operation cost is 8.98/Y³. This equates to \$898.00 per barge load (100Y³). This cost includes wages, fuel, and routine maintenance (oil, grease, filters). In order to assure adequate funding, a fee of \$1,250.00/Barge Load is recommended by the DSG. This will cover expenses for future increased fuel costs and any unexpected repairs other than routine maintenance. This recommended fee is \$6.00 to \$10.00 per cubic yard less than what a private contractor would charge.
- b. The DSG reviewed the Freeholder Private Dredging Contract. Changes to the agreement may easily be made, if the LLCD Board decides to adjust the current approved fee. Partial barge loads will be priced at the cost of a full barge load. An updated "Liability and Indemnification" clause states that the LLCD will not be held responsible for damages except in cases of gross negligence. This will include any damage to sea walls or shoreline dock structures. It will be recommended that all docks or non permanent structures be removed from the lake prior to private dredging. The LLCD will require payment in advance. At this time, the DSG recommends approval of the Private Dredging Service Agreement after Board review.

II. Contractual Dredging/LLCD Dredging

a. The DSG compared the costs of sediment removal using private contractors and in-house operations. The DSG received a quote from SRS, Sediment Removal Services, which gave us a cost of \$15.40/Y³. This includes using our disposal site, and does not include mobilization/demobilization costs. Mobilization/demobilization increases the cost substantially. Dick Payne, LLCD's Contractor, from 2006-2008 averaged \$18.86/Y³. Based on the report compiled by Shirley Watkins, LLCD Accountant, our cost per cubic yard for in-house operations is \$8.98/Y³. Considering the cost of private contractors to mobilize/demobilize and use of LLCD disposal site, it is clear the LLCD's in-house operation is fiscally more efficient. The DSG recommends to the Board that the LLCD focuses on continuing the current in-house operation for, at least 2013.





PURCHASE AGREEMENT

This Purchase Agreement is entered into by and between Lake Lemon Conservancy District with a principal address of 7599 N. Tunnel Road, Unionville, IN 47468 (hereinafter "LLCD") and Deaton's Waterfront Services, LLC, an Indiana limited liability company with a principal address of 10997 Olio Road, Fishers, IN 46040 (hereinafter "Deaton"):

In consideration of the mutual promises herein, the parties agree as follows:

1. Services to be performed: Deaton shall furnish all labor and materials for the construction of a "U-shaped" wooden floating dock in accordance with the Specifications set forth on Exhibit "A," attached hereto and incorporated as a part of this Agreement (the "Work").

Total Amount of Materials and Labor: \$18,792.00

All Work shall be completed by DEATON on or by July 1st, 2013. Any alteration or deviation from specifications attached as Exhibit A will require a modified, written agreement, signed by the Parties.

- 2. Payment: LLCD will pay a deposit in the total amount of \$9,396 upon execution of this Agreement and will pay in full the balance due of \$9,396 for Work satisfactorily performed, as determined by the LLCD in its sole discretion, by DEATON within thirty (30) days of the date of invoice ("Due Date").
- 3. LLCD's Obligation: LLCD will provide DEATON access to the property that is the subject of this Agreement at all reasonable times necessary to DEATON's Work.
- 4. Warranty: All material installed in the Work is guaranteed by DEATON to be new and as specified in Exhibit A. Deaton warrants that all Work shall be completed in a good and workmanlike manner and in accordance with industry standards. The Work shall be free from defects in material or workmanship and such shall be warranted by DEATON for a one year period from the date of completion except for cause relating to acts of God or alterations to the Work by LLCD. The flotation system shall be warranted for a period of ten (10) years. DEATON shall assign and convey all manufacturer's warranty on materials installed in the Work to the LLCD.
- 5. Relationship of the Parties: DEATON is an independent contractor in the performance of each and every part of this Agreement and solely and personally liable for the costs of all labor, equipment, tools, and expenses in connection therewith and for any and all damages that may occur because of DEATON's performance under this Agreement, whether for personal injuries or damages of any kind. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed in any way to constitute DEATON as the agent or representative of the LLCD. DEATON shall maintain appropriate commercial general liability insurance in a minimum amount of Two

- Million Dollars (\$2,000,000.00) per occurrence. The LLCD and CBU shall be included as additional named-insureds on the policy. DEATON shall provide proof of insurance to LLCD.
- 6. Liability. The LLCD and DEATON acknowledge and agree that the services to be performed by DEATON under this Agreement are to be performed by DEATON at its own risk and that it assumes all responsibility for any damages or injuries that may result from its performance of services under this Agreement. DEATON agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the LLCD and CBU from any and all liability for any injuries (including death), damages, loss or claims based upon, arising out of, or in any manner connected with its services provided under this Agreement, which includes but is not limited to claims for workers' compensation coverage. It is further agreed that DEATON shall bear all costs of obtaining and maintaining for the term of this Agreement all required licensing, permits, liability insurance and Workers' Compensation insurance, as required by law.
- 7. Tax Liability. DEATON shall exonerate, indemnify, and hold harmless the LLCD from and against, and shall assume full responsibility for, payment of self-employment taxes, all federal, state and local taxes, or contributions imposed or required under unemployment insurance, workmen's compensation, social security, and income tax laws with respect to the services under this Agreement.
- 8. Remedies. A party shall be entitled to seek and obtain all relief, whether in law or in equity, for breach of the Agreement by the other party, including damages and reasonable attorney fees.
