The April 20th, 2016 Board of Directors Meeting of the Lake Lemon Conservancy District was held at the Benton Township Senior Citizens Building and was called to order by Chairman Pam Dugan at 6:00 PM.

BOARD MEMBERS PRESENT: Pam Dugan, Sue Miller, Lance Eberle, Mary Jane Brown, John Schell, Andy Hoffman, and Mike Blackwell. ALSO PRESENT: Adam Casey, Manager; James Van Tassel, Operations Supervisor; and LLCD Freeholders (see attached sign-in sheet).

 - a. Long Causeway Maintance Letter: Discussion (Dugan)

- The Board discussed a letter written by Dugan detailing the road and roadside maintenance of the Long Causeway on South Shore Dr. The board approved this letter to be sent to the respective parties in Brown and Monroe Counties.
- b. Riddle Point Park Improvements: Discussion (Hoffman)
 - i. The board discussed needed maintenance to the bathouse. The roof of the bathhouse is in disrepair and should be addressed prior to any finishing work on the interior. Future interior work could include new flooring and refinishing of the walls.
 - Staff will receive quotes on bathouse roof repairs and discuss with a design professional.
 - iii. Other items discussed for park improvements included: Fire Rings. Grills, Playground Equipment, New Open Air Shelter on Far Point, Cleaning Crew for Bathouse, Riddle Point Survey Handouts.

HOFFMAN MOTIONED TO HAVE STAFF RECEIVE QUOTES FOR BATHHOUSE ROOF REPAIRS WITH ADVICE FROM A DESIGN PROFESSIONAL. BROWN SECONDED THE MOTION. ALL "AYE'S". THE MOTION CARRIED.

- V. Manager's Report (Casey)
 - a. Small Barge: Update
 - i. Legal Opnion on Dredging Walker Lane (see attached)
 - ii. Little Africa Disposal Site
 - Casey will speak with the CBU and discuss utilizing Little Africa. A storm water management plan will need to be implemented prior to any development of Little Africa.
 - iii. Final Payment Options for Barge/Motors
 - 1. Final Payment will be due mid to late May
 - In order to keep some reserves in the checking account, a loan was suggested to finance the remainder of the barge cost.
 - Eberle recommended going forward with the loan process.

 - 1. Two Quotes were received (see attached)
 - Staff is waiting on the cost associated with using Biodegradable Hydraulic Oil.

 - i. Currently dredging on West side of Point Idalawn.
 - Lake proper debris has been cleaned up, and shoreline debris will be cleaned up in Mid May.
 - iii. Several private shoreline erosion control jobs have been performed.
- c. Kenny Clark: Land Use Agreement
 - i. New conract incurs a \$1,000.00 annual fee.
 - Eberle made suggestions on the insurance clause and will give feedback to Casey.



As I am sure you are aware, this stretch of road provides the most direct link between not only the south shore and eastern edges of the lake to Bloomington and emergency services, but also is an important link for much of the north shore to these services as well. It is also a strip used widely by shoreline fishermen. The maintenance and resulting integrity of the road surface is critical to the safety of both drivers and those on the banks of the causeway as there is little room for error with deep water on both sides. Potholes (especially at this time of year) and a large indentation in the road over a culvert are especially treacherous in this scenario. Additionally, routine mowing of these banks is imperative for improved visibility both of edges of the roadway and of pedestrians. One of the main complaints brought to my attention is the lack of mowing of these banks until very late in the summer or even as late as mid-September, thereby allowing the grasses and vegetation to reduce visibility substantially.

It is my understanding that Monroe County is responsible for the majority of the maintenance of aforementioned causeway and that Brown County is responsible for a smaller section on the easternmost end. Is there a set routine of coordination between your two departments, or do you each manage your own piece on your own schedules? It would be most appreciated if you could help me/us to understand the plan/schedule for management. In that regard, I would like to offer that we have a very active volunteer segment of our freeholder base which might be useful in coordinating better efforts at consistent maintenance of the long causeway going forward.

Thank you in advance for your response to this inquiry. On behalf of the LLCD and our freeholders, we look forward to working together to improve the status of this vital transportation artery.

RE: Dredging on Private Property

Dear Adam:

You have asked whether, in the course of its dredging project, the Lake Lemon Conservancy District ("LLCD") may dredge certain portions of Lake Lemon (or perhaps an entire channel) that, potentially, is private property owned by taxpaying freeholders on the Lake. The answer is yes.

Preliminarily, I should note that your question refers to one particular channel of the Lake for which the Brown County GIS shows that the freeholders' property lines meet in the middle of the channel, as opposed to ending at the shore line—thus leaving no area in the middle that is not owned privately. It should be noted that this is based entirely on the GIS depiction, not on any official survey. The true ownership of the channel has not yet, to my knowledge, been determined by any official survey. The depiction on the Brown County GIS might not be accurate. Nevertheless, you asked, even assuming that the channel is owned privately, whether LLCD may still dredge there. I believe it can.

I understand that the concern is not that the landowners on either side of the channel want to prevent LLCD from bringing dredging equipment onto what potentially might be their private property. Indeed, I understand that the landowners want LLCD to dredge the channel to ensure continued access to the Lake. Rather, the concern, as I understand it, comes from freeholders elsewhere on the Lake who question whether LLCD should dredge what, potentially, might be private property. I understand that both the freeholders on the channel and the freeholders who voiced the question pay taxes to LLCD for the upkeep and maintenance of the Lake.

I further understand that, if LLCD does not dredge the channel in question, the failure to dredge the channel could, potentially, harm neighboring portions of the Lake—that is, neighboring

portions that are *not* owned privately. Namely, the failure to dredge the channel could cause sediment from the channel to spill out into the neighboring portions of the Lake, thus harming boat access for the neighboring areas. Thus, dredging the channel could benefit not only the channel itself, but also the neighboring portions of the Lake, as well.

With those facts in mind, I am not aware of any portion of Indiana's Conservancy Act that would prevent LLCD from dredging the channel in question. As you know, LLCD was established pursuant to the Indiana Conservancy Act. The Act requires each conservancy district in the state to elect a board of directors. Each district's board derives its powers from the Act. See IC 14-33-5-20. Perhaps for obvious reasons, the drafters of the Conservancy Act did not list each and every action that a board may or may not take under the Act. Instead, the drafters granted broad powers to the boards, and then commanded the boards to exercise those powers "to accomplish each purpose for which the district is established." See IC 14-33-5-20(11). The Act specifically states that it "shall be liberally construed" to allow boards to accomplish the purposes for which their district was created. See IC 14-33-23-6.

These broad, general powers that are granted to LLCD by the Conservancy Act serve as the backdrop for answering your question about the particular channel that is at issue here. In addition to these broad, general powers, there are two sections of the Conservancy Act that are more specifically relevant to your question. One section is IC 14-33-23-1. That section states that LLCD's board, its staff, and its employees "may enter land in the district and other land near the district as is necessary for district purposes." The other section is IC 14-33-6-13(13). That section states that LLCD's board has the power to perform necessary construction and maintenance work "outside the district" (or even outside the state of Indiana) if the work helps further the district plan or benefits the property in the district. Taken together, these two sections make clear that LLCD may enter onto private land within the district to perform maintenance work. Indeed, the statutes give LLCD the power to perform such work on land outside of the district. If LLCD can perform necessary maintenance work on privately-owned land within the district—as is at issue here. There is no provision in the Conservancy Act that states that LLCD is constrained to performing maintenance work only on publicly-owned land.

LLCD's lease with the City of Bloomington also is instructive. The lease states that LLCD must "keep and maintain in good repair <u>all</u> portions of the Lake." [Lease ¶ 8 (emphasis added).] The lease further states: "Lessee [LLCD] agrees to not ... permit within Lessee's jurisdictional boundaries any activity which will or may have the effect of increasing ... the rate of siltation of the Lake bottom." [Lease ¶ 8.] The Brown County GIS lists the City of Bloomington as the owner of several parcels in the vicinity of the channel in question. The channel and the surrounding areas all lie within the boundaries of the district. Thus, in my opinion, even if the channel is owned privately, it is in keeping with the terms of the lease—and arguably a requirement on LLCD to remain in compliance with the lease—for LLCD to dredge the channel in order to maintain "all" portions of the Lake and/or to prevent silt from the channel from leaking out and harming the Lake bottom in any other portion of the Lake.

There is a Chapter within the Conservancy Act, Chapter 12, that is entitled "Improvements Benefitting Only Certain Property." See IC 14-33-12. Despite its title, Chapter 12 does not apply to the channel that is in question here. Chapter 12 applies only if a determination was made at the time of the adoption of the district plan that certain improvements would benefit some but not all of the property within the district. See IC 14-33-12-1. Moreover, Chapter 12 applies only if the district plan specifically states that only certain property will be benefitted. Regarding the channel that is at issue here, no such determination was made at the time of the adoption of LLCD's district plan. The district plan was approved in 1999. It makes no specific mention of the channel. Chapter 12 does not apply.

Based on the foregoing, I do not believe that LLCD is prevented from dredging the channel in question, if it wishes to do so-regardless of whether or not the channel lies within the boundaries of certain freeholders' private property.

LAND USE AGREEMENT

THIS LAND USE AGREEMENT (hereinafter referred to as "Agreement") is made and entered into on April 20th, 2016 (the "Effective Date"), by and between KENNETH D. CLARK and EDITH A CLARK ("CLARK"), and the LAKE LEMON CONSERVANCY DISTRICT ("LLCD").

Article 1. LAND

- Section 1.01 Land. CLARK, for and in consideration of the conditions stated by this Agreement, to be performed and observed by LLCD, demises to LLCD, and LLCD accepts from CLARK, a portion of the unimproved real estate located in part of the South half of the Northwest quarter and a part of the North half of the Southwest quarter of Section 27, Township 10 North, Range 1 East in Monroe County, Indiana, as the tract containing 46.39 acres, more or less, which real estate is depicted in Exhibit A, attached hereto and made a part hereof, and referred to as the "Demised Land."
- Section 1.02. **Warranty of Title**. CLARK represents and warrants that they are the owner in fee simple absolute of the Demised Land.
- Section 1.03. **Warranty of Quiet Enjoyment** . CLARK agrees that LLCD, upon performance of the conditions of this Agreement, shall hold and use the Demised Land for the term of the Agreement without hindrance or interruption by CLARK or any other person or persons claiming under CLARK, except as herein expressly provided.

Article 2. TERM

- Section 2.01. **Commencement and Expiration Dates** This Agreement shall commence on the Effective Date and end on December 31st, 2019, unless extended as provided in Section 2.02.
- Section 2.02. **Renewal** Providing there are no defaults, this Agreement may be renewed for successive one (1) year periods for a cumulative total of three (3) years by LLCD giving notice of renewal, in writing, to CLARK at least sixty (60) days prior to the end of the then-existing term, and upon all the terms and conditions of this Agreement remaining in full force and effect.

Article 3. PAYMENT, TAXES AND INSURANCE

Section 3.01. **Payment** LLCD shall pay CLARK the sum of one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) per calendar year for use of the Demised Land. Payment for calendar year 2016 shall be made within fifteen (15) days of the Effective Date written above. Thereafter, payment for calendar year 2017 shall be made on or before January 31, 2017; payment for calendar year 2018 shall be made on or before January 31, 2018; and payment for calendar year 2019 shall be made on or before January 31, 2019. In the event that the Term of this agreement is extended beyond calendar year 2019 pursuant to Section 2.02 above, payment shall be made on or before the 31st day of January for each renewal year, as well.

Section 3.02. **Taxes** CLARK shall continue to pay all real property taxes and assessments on the Demised Land during the Term or any extension thereof.

Section 3.03. Insurance

- A. Waiver of Claim. CLARK and its agents shall have no liability to LLCD for any damage to the property of LLCD located in or about the Demised Land. LLCD hereby waives all claims for recovery from CLARK. This waiver shall not apply to intentional or negligent acts of CLARK.
- B. Insurance. LLCD shall obtain and keep in force during the term of this Agreement a policy of comprehensive public liability insurance insuring CLARK and LLCD against any liability arising out of the ownership, use, occupancy or maintenance of the Demised Land by the LLCD.

- C. Waiver of Subrogation. Without affecting any other rights or remedies, LLCD and CLARK each hereby release and relieve the other, and waive their right to recover damage against the other, for loss of or damage to the Demised Land arising out of or incident to the perils required to be insured against herein. The effect of such releases and waivers is not limited by the amount of insurance carried or required, or by deductibles applicable hereto. The parties agree to have their respective property damage insurance carriers waive any right to subrogation that such companies may have against CLARK or LLCD, as the case may be, so long as the insurance is not invalidated thereby.
- D. Indemnity. Except for CLARK's negligence or willful misconduct, LLCD shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless the Demised Premises and CLARK from and against any and all claims, damages, judgments, attorney's fees, expenses and/or liabilities arising out of, involving, or in connection with, the use of the premises by LLCD up to the date of termination of this Agreement.

Article 4. USE OF PREMISES

Section 4.01 Use LLCD shall have the right to use the Demised Land for any lawful purpose but it is understood and agreed that the primary purpose for use of the land is for the deposit of sediment removed from Lake Lemon in conjunction with the Lake Lemon Sediment Removal project on an "as needed" basis by the LLCD. The LLCD shall be responsible for the costs of site preparation, including creating necessary access to the site, and for the costs of transporting and placing such sediment deposit onto the Demised Premises. CLARK shall own and have title to the sediment deposits for purposes he deems appropriate in his sole discretion and LLCD shall have no claims thereto. CLARK agrees to implement and maintain required erosion control measures with regard to the sediment at all times.

Article 5. DEFAULT AND REMEDIES

Section 5.01. **Default** No failure to perform any condition or covenant of this Agreement shall entitle CLARK to terminate this Agreement unless such failure shall have continued for thirty (30) days after notice in writing requiring the performance of such condition shall have been given to LLCD, and unless, if such default is of such a nature that it cannot be remedied within such time, LLCD shall fail to cure such default within such additional time as is reasonably necessary to cure the default, provided that LLCD shall commence to cure the default within this period and thereafter shall diligently continue the curing of the default. The LLCD may terminate the Agreement if use of the land is no longer necessary by the LLCD, in its discretion. In the event of breach of the Agreement, the non-breaching party may pursue all damages available in law or in equity.

Article 6. SURRENDER OF POSSESSION

Section 6.01. **Surrender of Possession** Unless otherwise mutually agreed by the parties, within ten (10) days after termination of the Agreement, LLCD agrees to deliver possession of the Demised Land to CLARK free and clear of any liens or encumbrances.

Article 7. MECHANICS' LIENS

Section 7.01. **Prohibition of Liens** LLCD shall not suffer or permit any mechanics' liens to be filed against LLCD's interest in any improvements on the Demised Land by reason of any work, labor, services, or materials supplied or claimed to have been supplied to LLCD. If any such mechanics' liens or materialman's liens shall be recorded against any improvements thereof, LLCD shall cause the same to be removed or, and in the alternative, if LLCD in good faith desires to contest the same, LLCD shall be privileged to do so, but in such case LLCD hereby agrees to indemnify and save CLARK harmless from all liability for damages occasioned thereby and shall, in the event of a judgment of foreclosure upon said mechanic's liens, cause the same to be discharged and removed prior to the execution of such judgment.

Article 8. GENERAL PROVISIONS

Section 8.01. **No Waiver of Breach** No failure by either CLARK or LLCD to insist upon the strict performance by the other of a condition of this Agreement or to exercise any right or remedy consequent upon a breach thereof shall constitute a waiver of any such breach or of such condition.

Section 8.02. Time of Essence. Time is of the essence of this Agreement.

Section 8.03. **Successors in Interest** Each and all of the covenants, conditions, and restrictions in this Agreement shall inure to the benefit of and shall be binding upon the successors in interest of CLARK.

Section 8.04. **Entire Agreement** This Agreement contains the entire agreement of the parties with respect to the matters covered herein, and no other agreement, statement, or promise made by any party, or to any employee, officer, or agent of any party, which is not contained in this Agreement shall be binding or valid.

Section 8.05. **Partial Invalidity** If any term, covenant, condition, or provision of this Agreement is held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, void, or unenforceable, the remainder of the provisions shall remain in full force and effect and shall in no way be affected, impaired, or invalidated.

Section 8.06. Attorney's Fees In the event either CLARK or LLCD shall bring any action or proceeding for damages for an alleged breach of any provision of this Agreement or to enforce, protect or establish any right or remedy of either party, the prevailing party shall be entitled to recover as a part of such action or proceedings reasonable attorney's fees and court costs.

Section 8.07. **Modification** This Agreement is not subject to modification except in writing, agreed upon by the parties.



The parties shall share the cost of retaining a mediator in equal amounts.
