


RIDDLE POINT PARK RULES

Sun & Sand

There is a public beach within the park. The beach area is clearly marked with buoys to notify lake users of the safe swimming area.

The park has a sand volleyball court and a horseshoe pit. Volleyballs and horseshoes can be borrowed from the gatehouse.

A top of the line new playground was installed in 2021.


Shelter House

A large open shelter house is available for rental from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m.. It's a unique way to host a graduation or birthday party, family reunion, or any other special gathering. There is electric, water, picnic tables, a large grill, and gorgeous views of the lake. Please visit our website for up-to-date daily shelter house rental pricing.

Fishing

Many people visit the park to fish from the shoreline. Riddle Point is optimal for shoreline fishing as it is surrounded by water on three sides and has ample shoreline.

There is also a public boat ramp with daily and annual launch permits available for purchase. This is the only public boat launch on Lake Lemon!



More Fun

There is a short hiking trail on the south end of the park just beyond Camp Rock (part of Boys and Girls Club). There are six charcoal grills for public use throughout Riddle Point Park.

Keep your eyes peeled to catch a glimpse of eagles, deer, foxes, and loads of other wildlife. We also have many native plants on the property. Enjoy a walk through the park and discover purple coneflower, mountain mint, black-eyed Susan, cup plant, and more.
