Speed

- Sunrise to Sunset- A person may not operate a watercraft at a rate of speed greater than is reasonable and prudent,
- Sunset to Sunrise- A person may not operate a watercraft at a speed greater than 10 miles per hour.
- Shoreline- Within 200 hundred feet of the shoreline and within marked idle zones the maximum speed is 5 miles per hour.
- No watercraft is allowed within 500 hundred feet of the spillway.

Swimming / Anchoring

- From sunrise to sunset, boat anchoring and swimming are at your own risk.
- Boat anchoring and/or swimming are permitted only within buoy swim areas at the dam embayment and short causeway.
- Embankment docking is prohibited.

Spotter Mandate

- For tow sports such as skiing, tubing, and wakeboarding, at least one person in the boat in addition to the operator must give full attention to watching the object or person being towed.
- Towing skiers or other objects is not allowed between sunset and sunrise.

Violations

- Penalties and fines for violations of the Indiana State Statutes are established by the State of Indiana.
- Violations of LLCD regulations constitutes a trespass and subject to:
- 1.Removal from the lake:
- 2. Denial of lake privileges;
- 3. Appropriate criminal prosecution for criminal mischief or criminal trespass;
- 4. Civil damages for injury or damage to property of LLCD.

Rules, Regulations, & Codes of Conduct

All watercraft must be registered with LLCD and issued a permit before launching & have a current state boat registration. Such permit shall be displayed on the port (left) bow.

General Lake Rules

- A valid Driver's license (or I.D. card and completion of State approved Boating Education Course—Age 15) is required to operate any watercraft propelled by a motor with a factory rating greater than 10 horsepower.
- Persons may not throw, dump, place, or deposit any litter, filth, unwholesome substances (e.g. sewage) in or upon the waters or banks of the lake.
- All trash and debris is to be kept in the boat and deposited in trash receptacles upon leaving the lake.
- Please respect the lake and lake wildlife and do not discard bait fish in the lake.
- Excessive engine noise, loud music, or any other forms of noise pollution are strictly prohibited.

Safety Regulations

- Fish and Game Laws of the State of Indiana are in effect on Lake Lemon.
- Passengers must ride inside the watercraft at all times while in motion (i.e., no riding on bow or gunwales).
- Watercraft involved in an accident or a collision should: stop immediately; stay at the scene; offer assistance to injured parties; and notify the DNR Central Dispatch: 812-837-9536

General Boating Rules

- Operating a watercraft while intoxicated is a criminal offense under Indiana Statutes.
- Do not unnecessarily block boat ramps or parking areas.
- Sailboats, rowboats, or any handpropelled craft have the right-of-way over powered watercraft.
- Watercraft leaving a dock have the rightof-way over watercraft approaching.
- When two watercrafts are approaching each other on the same line, both shall bear to the right so as to pass on the left side of each other.
- When two watercrafts are going to cross paths (i.e., at right angles) the boat on the right has the right-of-way.
- Do not anchor in any traveled part of the lake, which may impede or interfere with the safe passage of other watercraft.

Night Boating

- No watercraft shall be operated between sunset and sunrise unless equipped with proper lights in good working order as prescribed by the Indiana Boating Laws.
- Maximum length of stay for any one-time visit is 3 consecutive days/2 consecutive nights unless moored at a private or commercial dock. (Daily boat fees apply).

Angler-to-Others Good Manners

- Keep at least 50 to 100 feet apart, and if possible, much farther from piers, swimming areas, boats, or persons.
- Do not park on or use private property.
- Do not enter private docks to retrieve snagged lures.
- If piers/docks, etc. are occupied, fishing is prohibited within 100 feet of the property.
- If piers/docks, etc. are unoccupied, fishing may proceed within a respectful and safe distance.
- Avoid bumping, hooking, etc., of piers, docks, boats, other personal property and people by maintaining safe distances and careful fishing.
- Do not cast at or near people.

Angler-to-Angler Good Manners

- Stay at least 50 to 100 feet apart when fishing or passing a boat.
- Slow boat to idling speed if conditions require closer than 50 feet to pass.
- If conditions merit closer fishing, ask for permission to come closer.
- Remember all anglers regardless of age, gender, size of boat/motor, or type of angler have equal rights to use the water.
